For a long time, humans and animals have developed multiple and complex interactions in the fields of tourism, leisure and sports. However, much of the existing research on the ways in which humans and animals interact in tourism, leisure and sport has been carried out in the context of developed countries. The limited research suggests that the interactions between both species depend largely on the specific context in which they develop. In this sense, little has been documented on human-animal interactions in socioeconomic, cultural and environmental contexts of the Global South. This has resulted in a limited, partial and hegemonic understanding of, and debates on, human-animal relationships worldwide.

This book aims to document the multiple and complex relationships between humans and animals in the fields of tourism, leisure and sport in contexts of the Global South. It aims to bring together empirical or conceptual works that reveal the different theoretical, ethical, methodological and practical perspectives on how human-animal relations are configured under the conditions of developing countries.

All contributions must be framed in the context of the Global South. Proposals from early career researchers and practitioners from developing countries are particularly welcome. Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Animals in tourism and travel
- Animals in leisure and recreation
- Animals in sports and competitions
- Working animals in tourism, leisure and sports
- Ethical positions in human-animal relations in leisure studies
- Disciplinary perspectives on human-animal interactions in leisure
- Emerging methodologies in human-animal interactions in leisure
- Current practices in developing countries

Abstracts must include title, author, affiliation and email. Both the abstract and the chapter must be written in English.



The selected abstracts will be integrated and sent as a publication proposal to CABI. Accepted abstracts will be invited to submit their full chapter. Each chapter is expected to have an initial length of between 5,000 and 6,000 words. The expected delivery date of the first draft of the full chapter is January 2024.
